- Gina says: There has been some confusion regarding Project Report Forms and I just want to clarify. Some volunteers have mentioned that under the "Volunteer" section (where you enter the names of all volunteers on the project), there might be an extra row for an additional name, but it is not needed (5 rows are present, but only 4 volunteers need to be entered). The form will not let you submit it if there are extra blank rows, but it was unclear how to get rid of these extra rows. All you have to do to eliminate extra rows is change the "total number of volunteers" field to correctly correlate with the number of volunteers in your project. This field automatically generates the number of rows based on the number entered. So, if you find you have an extra row check the number of volunteers you entered (change from 5 to 4 and the 5<sup>th</sup> row will be eliminated).

- Add Eagle Creek as a Caretaker Section Everyone in support! In addition, MHC discussed adding Indian Springs cut off and the 400 trail as additional care taker sections in support of the PCT. Sacramento supports these inclusions. Dennis Beard is the new caretaker for Lower Eagle Creek (up to 7 ½ mile camp) and Busdriver John is the new caretaker for Upper Eagle Creek and the Indian Springs Cutoff Trail. John's PCT section is now officially Vacant. The 400 trail is also Vacant.
